TEACHING

- N426: Nursing Care of the Mentally III Across the Lifespan (6 credits) This theory and clinical course, taught in the senior year, focuses on using the nursing process to provide care to mentally ill clients across the lifespan.
- N505: Bio-Behavior I (4 credits)

This course consists of theory examining the effects and/or sequels of alterations in selected bio-behavioral processes in the adult human suffering from illnesses with critical onsets, multi-system failure and long-term, unstable conditions.

- N506: Bio-Behavior II (4 credits) Same as Bio-Behavior I with different illness exemplars.
- N507: Clinical Practicum I (2 credits) The purpose of this clinical practicum is to provide opportunities for students to apply content from N505 Bio-Behavior I.
- N585: Advanced Nurse Practitioner Clinical Practicum (4 credits) This clinical nursing course is for preparation related to specialty nurse practitioner roles and advanced nurse certification.
- N128: Health and Social Justice Through Service-Learning (2 credits) The service-learning course integrates learning experiences around social justice and responsibility with professional responsibilites for civic engagement.
- N608: Topics in Advanced Nursing Practice Specialty I (2 credits) This seminar focuses on therapeutic interventions based on biopsychosocial theories, evidence-based standards of care, and practice guidelines used by advanced practice nurses with patients requiring acute and chronic care. Emphasis is placed on individual therapies.
- N609: Topics in Advanced Nursing Practice Specialty II (2 credits) This seminar focuses on therapeutic interventions based on biopsychosocial theories, evidence-based standards of care, and practice guidelines used by advanced practice nurses with patients requiring acute and chronic care. Emphasis is placed on group therapies.
- N358: Mental Health and Illness Across the Lifespan (8 credits 3 Lecture/5 Clinical) This junior level course allows students to examine the constructs of mental health and mental illness. They analyze factors that contribute to the development, expression, and course of mental illness and learn to manage the care of mentally ill clients.
