STUDENT LEADERSHIP: Leah Huang, SN4



Leah is a senior BSN student at UMSN who consistently goes above and beyond. As the senior president of NSG, she led planning and facilitating meetings, taking charge with organizing finances, and contributing to the overall success of the organization. She is also Logistics chair of CURIS, a student organization dedicated to raising awareness about public health efforts and is the backbone of CURIS's outreach initiatives, securing grant funding for the Maize and Blue Cupboard, coordinating a campus-wide NARCAN training event and a food forum. Leah's motivation and initiative to work hard and tackle problems head on makes her stand out as a leader.

FRIEND OF NURSING: Robert C. Hyzy, M.D.



As Medical Director, Dr. Hyzy has been deeply committed to mentoring and educating nurses. When he served as Keystones Director he nominated nurses to serve on the ICU Advisory board and sought out the nursing team for direction. He is a frequent contributor to nursing education days and sought out nursing contributions at Physician Morbidity & Mortality Rounds. He prioritizes bedside nurses during rounds, inviting them to present first. He supported nurses as co investigators on research projects promoted interprofessional education by championing nursing participation in new House Officer orientation. Throughout his leadership, he has remained a consistent advocate for nursing practice—listening closely, supporting innovation, and elevating nursing voices in all aspects of patient care.

As the nursing director for Pavilion 11 at University Hospital, Yuwanna Nelson guided her staff through the transition to a new unit, including onboarding, training, and mentoring 44 new nurses. In this challenging endeavor she fostered staff engagement and ownership throughout the planning and move process. She created a team that is highly engaged, proud of their new environment, and dedicated to achieving strong patient outcomes. Yuwanna is praised as a leader who leads by example while making learning and achieving targets fun for her team.

EXCELLENCE IN NURSING PRACTICE: Natalie Ford, BSN, RN-BC, PCCN

As Educational Nurse Coordinator (ENC), Natalie played a pivotal role in launching the new Pavilion 9 surgical unit by leading the education and training of cross-specialty nursing teams, ensuring seamless patient care delivery. She also maintained weekly bedside hours giving patient care, demonstrating a model of hands-on leadership and clinical expertise that bridges education, administration, and frontline nursing. Her many contributions to practice include policy refinement and educational programming for remote telemetry nursing, quality improvement projects, such as the “Turn Team” initiative, which reduced pressure injury rates, involvement in the Nursing Gateway Committee, UBC Chair Task Force, and ENC Orientation Team, and creation of Novice Nurse and Refresher Crash Course training days.

EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH: Dr. Lixin Song, PhD, RN, FAAN

Dr. Song is praised as a visionary scientist in the field of oncology nursing. At the heart of Dr. Song’s research is a program of intervention development, testing, and clinical implementation, and translation that has reshaped evidence-based practice for oncology nurses. Recognized for her expertise in family-based cancer research, she is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing. As a principal investigator (PI) or MPI, she has secured research grants from federal agencies, including the National Cancer Institute, National Institute of Nursing Research, National Library of Medicine, and the Department of Defense, to conduct randomized clinical trials that test interventions on improving the health outcomes among patients with cancer and their caregivers.

EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION: Amy Buckenmeyer, PhD, MPH, RN, CPH, CPNP-PC, FNAP and Susan Wintermeyer-Pingel, DNP, MS, RN, ACNS-BC

Dr. Buckenmeyer is a mentor and teacher who creates rigorous, supportive, and practice-relevant learning experiences in population health. She consistently receives excellent evaluations from her students. She led population health curriculum innovations including a major redesign of six courses totaling 15 credits. Her scholarship focuses on nurse health coaching, social determinants of health, interprofessional education, and innovative applications of artificial intelligence to support care planning and resource acquisition.



Dr. Wintermeyer-Pingel consistently demonstrates excellence in teaching through her commitment to students and her learner-centered approach. She promotes a strong foundation in both theory and practice, while ensuring that each student feels individually supported, even in a large class. Her teaching emphasizes evidenced-based care and utilizing best practice to formulate plans and clinical decisions.

RISING STAR: Farida Bibi Mughal, MSN, RN

As a doctoral student, Farida has demonstrated her future impact as a nurse scientist. She made significant contributions to the project on gender-based violence, in Pakistan during her internship at the Center for Global Health Equity, working effectively with an interdisciplinary team and contributing insights that enhanced the quality and relevance of the study. As an early-career researcher, she is already disseminating her work through peer-reviewed publications and presentations at prestigious international conferences. She has shown the professional behaviors and leadership qualities of a more advanced scholar, demonstrating compassion along with intellectual rigor in her work.

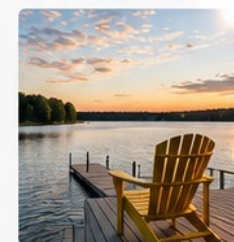

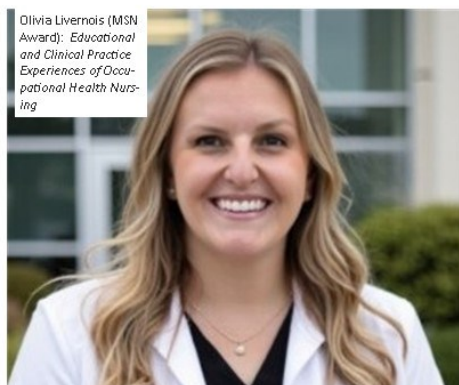


SCHOOL OF NURSING RESEARCH DAY 2026: RESEARCH, SCHOLARSHIP AND INNOVATION DAY

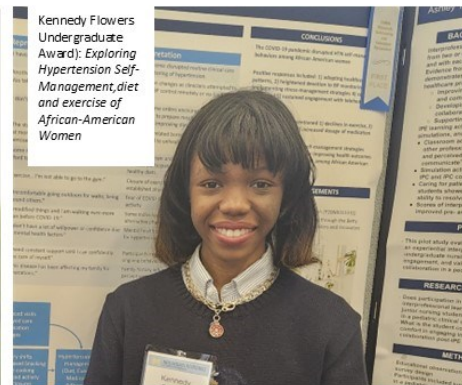

Breakout sessions featured practical discussions on how to effectively communicate nursing science, organized into three themes: Community and Public, Policy and Decision-Makers, and Institutions/Systems and Peers. 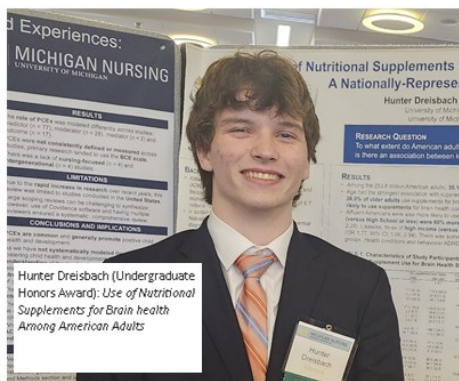

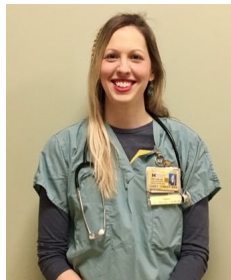

NURSING AT MICHIGAN POSTER DAY 2026

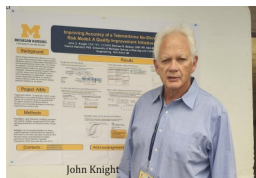
The annual Nursing at Michigan Poster Day, showcasing scholarship by nurses at the U of M Health was held in May during Nurses Week. This year's event featured 60 posters across a wide range of topics such as perinatal grief, postoperative care, teambuilding, early exposure to health careers, and home health care. Rho Chapter once again sponsored the People's Choice Award. Congratulations to this year's People's Choice winner, Casey Yunker, Education Nurse Coordinator, Cardiac Procedures Unit. Casey's project involved a hands-on simulation for opioid reversal, giving nurse a safe environment to improve skills and knowledge.



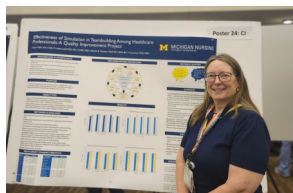

John Knight & Barbara Medvec: Their project analyzed over 525,000 telemedicine visits to refine and improve a clinic no-show prediction model, helping to reduce missed appointments and improve continuity of care.

Sandra Rye: Her co-authored project assessed the impact of simulation training interprofessional team building.

Suzanne Knight was the mentor for EBP fellow, Colleen May, and her project to improve first poke success rate in home infusion patients. Suzanne also co-authored a project utilizing virtual wayfinding to orient new nurses to a clinical unit from Interventional Radiology. Their project described an evidence-based intervention (aromatherapy) to reduce the significant pain and nausea that patients with uterine fibroids experience after undergoing uterine artery embolization procedure. Their unit will receive a donation from Rho Chapter to their unit education fund.



The awards day featured a keynote address by Rho member, Rebecca Williams, who described the process of implementing nursing innovations and her journey as an entrepreneur. Congratulations to Rebecca and all Rho members who presented at the conference.

TAKE ACTION: DOE WILL NOT INCLUDE NURSING IN PROFESSIONAL DEGREE PROGRAMS

Despite thousands of comments from the nursing community and the public, pushback from more than 150 bipartisan members of Congress, and a demonstrated need for nurses across the healthcare workforce, the Department of Education will not include nursing in professional degree programs. This action caps federal loans for advanced nursing degrees to \$20,500 per year.



TAKE ACTION: Support the Nursing is a Professional Degree Act:

This proposed bill was introduced in both the House of Representatives and the Senate (S.4568/H.R.8691).
