

#### RHO CHAPTER -SNA WALK TO END ALZHEIMERS SERVICE PROJECT







Rho Chapter teamed with the UM Student Nurses Association to raise funds for the Washtenaw County Walk to End Alzheimer's on October 20, 2024 at Ann Arbor Pioneer High School. This annual event aims to unite people in the fight against Alzheimer's and symbolizes hope for a cure through collective action. Our team's fundraising goal was \$500 and we raised 150% of our goal—almost \$800! Many Rho members supported us with online donations and twelve members attended the walk event on Sunday. The weather was perfect and our team visited the displays of information about dementia, support resources, research, and memorials. Each walker could choose a symbolic flower color representing their personal connection to the disease, like blue for someone living with Alzheimer's, purple for a loved one lost to the disease, and yellow for a caregiver. We also heard from patients, families, and friends who have been impacted by dementia.

Our student leader intern, Michelle Valdivia, organized this event and led participation by the Student Nurses Association. She did a wonderful job of communicating with participants and publicizing the event. Thank you, Michelle! And thank you to everyone who supported our team by walking or donating.
