Presidents' Call to Action

Dr. Ken Dion, retiring Sigma President, shared his organizational call to action "Be Bold" to raise our voices, and "step outside of our insular circle". He focused on three main points: economics, technology, and conservation.
 Economics. Dr. Dion reminded us that economics involves the study of power. And we as nurses have a great deal of power in the trust that the public has in each one of us as nurses. We need to find ways to

wield that trust ensure that we continue to make positive strides in the health of people everywhere. **Technology**: All day every day we interact with amazing technology. We are innovating and using technology more than anyone in healthcare. It is vital that we participate from inception to implementation. Most importantly, we need participate in the evaluation for improvements.

Conservation. When are striving to conserve the earth, we should also remember this includes conserving human capital. As we innovate, let us be cognizant of how that will affect our fellow humans. Our newly elected president, Dr. Sandra Garmon Bibb had the opportunity to share her inspiring Presidential Call

to Action: **Represent.** She charged that we, the members of Sigma, must embrace all that nursing embodies in the 21st century. We are well positioned to represent the change we want to see in the world. Not just by being a token representative of nursing at the table – by being the best of who we are and using our voice to make change. Dr. Garmon Bibb expanded upon on her Call to Action of Represent to include the following:

Reflect: show the change we want to see by communicating a caring culture. We can reflect the inclusive

and integrative art and science of nursing as we connect with others to transform healthcare globally. **Respect**: cultivating cultural humility. We must listen to others to understand the world around us. As we learn, with humility and grace, we can evaluate ourselves and examine our own culture. We will be ready to lead and commit to recognizing imbalances. Once we reach this stage, we can repair these imbalances.

Respond: championing contemporary practices. With our professional perspective and experience we will be key to advancing and transforming health care globally.

Represent means we must all make it personal. What does represent mean to you? We can represent by embracing our own uniqueness and what we bring to the nursing role and profession.
