To support the School of Nursing's ongoing mission of transforming face-to-face courses to web-hybrid and fully online experiences, the Project Management Office has developed a new Faculty Services Portal. Visitors to the Faculty Services Portal can get immediate technical support from U-M School of Nursing IT, expand their knowledge of teaching and learning tools through selfserve training and support resources, and learn about new instructional design services that can be requested through the portal.

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Instructional design services

To support the School of Nursing's growing demand for instructional design services, the Faculty Services Portal provides the following service request options.

 Quick Consultation service request is designed to give faculty an easy way to: Browse example project types. Get a rough estimate of the effort involved in completing a project. Directly schedule a consultation with an instructional designer (via Calendly). Faculty who require remote teaching assistance to support COVID 19-informed adjustments to instruction are encouraged to seek assistance through the Quick Consultation request process. 	DIY Canvas Course service request is for: Faculty or staff who wish to build a Canvas course using the latest version of the Digital Education Canvas Shell. The process begins with a meeting with an instructional designer to help identify goals and outcomes and to receive basic guidance on Canvas development. The do-it-yourselfer is then responsible for building and testing their new Canvas course and ensuring it aligns with approved academic guidelines.

Course Design or Redesign service request provides a comprehensive overview of the School of Nursing's Analysis, Design, Development, Implementation and Evaluation (ADDIE) Digital Education Process. Those interested in having their course designed or redesigned can submit their request to the Administrative Group for consideration. Once approval has been given, a team is assembled and course design begins.	The Big Idea service request option provides: A submission avenue for large projects that don't fit into the service request options above. Faculty interested in moving forward with their big ideas can submit a project request to the Administrative Group for consideration. Once approval has been given, a team of collaborators will be assembled to help you bring that big idea to life.

U-M BOX retirement

The University of Michigan has recently signed a two-year contract renewal with Box at our current pricing. At the end of this contract in December 2021, Box will change their pricing model for higher education and no longer offer unlimited storage. These changes pose a significant cost increase to the university. As a result, U-M will no longer offer U-M Box storage option as of December 2021.

An IT project team is currently investigating tools that will assist with the migration of all data from U-M Box to an appropriate U-M storage solution. ITS will continue to work closely with university leadership, unit IT and the university community to support the goal of migrating from U-M Box to other storage services.

Dropbox at U-M

One of the storage services that ITS has acquired for the university as a U-M Box cloud storage alternative is Dropbox. Dropbox at U-M is a cloud file storage option that provides automatic backup and is readily accessible from any device with an internet connection. Dropbox provides a way for faculty, staff and students to share and access their files via mobile devices and the web.
