Graduate Global Health Concentration

The global health concentration is offered to students in any master's or DNP program. It is designed to educate students about global health issues and provide an opportunity for practical field experience. The program promotes multidisciplinary prevention over treatment and community-based service over institutional care.

Requirements include 8 credit hours of coursework and an intercultural clinical immersion experience.

GLOBAL HEALTH CONCENTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Course Requirements: (8 credits total)

NURS 521 (3crs.): Perspectives in Global Health

This interdisciplinary clinically focused elective explores the issues that directly or indirectly affect health in low and middle resource countries.

Global Health Elective (3 crs.): Any course related to global health, from nursing, public health, or a related field.

NURS 697 (2 crs): Independent study based on field experience.

Approved Intercultural/Global Immersion Experience:

Eligible options include individual research, internship, volunteer opportunities, or a UMSN faculty-led field experience.

Declaring a Global Health Concentration:

1. Inform your academic advisor of your interest.

2. Meet with an Office of Global Affairs (OGA) advisor to obtain a work plan. Set up an appointment by email:

3. Work with OGA Advisor to complete forms to declare the concentration, approval of global immersion, elective courses, pre-departure preparation and post-program follow-up.

4. UMSN Grad Advisors will work with OGA to determine when all requirements for the concentration have been met.
