

Criteria for Faculty Leading Clinical Immersions Abroad

Over the past two years, there has been a sharp increase in student interest for study abroad experiences including School of Nursing courses with a clinical component. Additionally, faculty have stepped up to develop additional for-credit, clinical immersion courses. In response, the Office of Global Affairs, with input from faculty has developed the following criteria for faculty interested in taking students abroad for a clinical immersion for the first time.

Criteria for Primary Faculty Leads:

1. Previous international travel to destination country
2. Employed as a faculty member in the School of Nursing for a minimum of one-year
3. Positive teaching evaluations (E&E)
4. Previous participation in a clinical immersion with students as the primary or secondary faculty member responsible for a trip
5. Received positive evaluations/feedback from previous clinical global immersions
6. Participation in the "Faculty Fellows Program" sponsored by the Office of Global Affairs
7. Participation in pre-departure meetings conducted by the Office of Global Affairs

Criteria for Secondary Faculty Leads:

1. Employed as a faculty member in the School of Nursing for a minimum of one-year
2. Positive teaching evaluations (E&E)
3. Participation in the "Faculty Fellows Program" sponsored by the Office of Global Affairs
4. Participation in pre-departure meetings conducted by the Office of Global Affairs

Exceptions must be approved by the Associate Dean for Global Affairs, the Associate Dean for the Undergraduate Program and/or Department Chair.
